# Enforcement and Potential Enforcement Actions

# 102/105 Enforcement and Potential Enforcement Actions

- 401 Madison St., Shillington Borough (CM-06-00303): Arthur Turaj. Floodway Encroachment. As of July 20, 2023, DEP will now be issuing a consent order with penalties and require a full restoration plan be submitted.
- Longview Rd., Earl Twp (CM-06-00386): James Smith (Farmer). Stream, Floodway, Wetland Encroachments. As of September 14, 2023, DEP has approved a minor modification to the restoration plans to permit a revised log vane for fish habitat structure. The restoration plan is moving forward now to implementation.
- Green Hills Estates, Robeson Township (PAI030616004). The homeowner downstream at 465 Green Hills Rd pond is constantly stained and sediment will not settle out. There is not a constant sediment discharge from the site but the soil types do not promote settling. DEP and PFBC are aware of the pond situation and have been in touch with the developer and homeowner. 2/13/23: Received a copy of a 60 Day Notice Letter from the property owner's attorney to the developer and contractor. DEP is working on a Consent Assessment of Civil Penalty (CACP) for non-compliance items on 4/12/22, 6/2/22 and 10/6/22. On 4/4/23 notice was provided by the developer, 2000 Perkiomen Ave, LLC, that a resolution has been agreed to with the downstream pond owner. The agreement is unknown at this time. On 4/10/23, DEP proposed a Consent Assessment of Civil Penalty ("CACP") in the amount of \$10,968.00. An agreement between the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP"), Nick & Les, Inc. ("Nick & Les"), Lyons and Hohl, Inc. ("Lyons and Hohl"), and 2000 Perkiomen Ave., LLC ("2000 Perkiomen"), for non-compliance items on 4/12/22, 6/2/22 and 10/6/22. The District requested \$967.77 in cost recovery. CACP was executed on 5/17/23 and the cost recovery check was received on 5/22/23
- Bollinger Road/341 Hickory Road, Marion Twp (CM-06-00600) (Preserved Farm): Paul Sonnen, has retained counsel and contests that all of the fill must be removed. Marion Township is attempting to resolve the conflict with Mr. Sonnen regarding restoration versus obtaining a permit to conduct streambank stabilization in the area. The restoration plan or an after-the-fact Chapter 105 permit for streambank stabilization is due next.

313 Bowers Road/Burkholder-Sauder Earthen Dike Removal, Maxatawny Township, (ESP-06-03219) (CM-06-00394): The restoration plan has been approved, and is now being implemented
