## **102/105 Enforcement and Potential Enforcement Actions**

- 401 Madison St., Shillington Borough (CM-06-00303): Arthur Turaj. Floodway Encroachment. Mr. Turaj submitted the restoration plan to DEP, and DEP returned it with comments. On 4/5/24, the Township complained that additional fill was added along the floodway. BCCD refers the complaint to DEP as the site's enforcement is now in DEP's hands.
- 170 N. Bingaman Street Exeter Twp/St. Lawrence Borough (CM-06-00399): Un-permitted Stream Obstruction/Bridge Installation. 4/12/2024: The DEP, District, and responsible parties (Mr. Coulter and Mr. Lerch) are scheduling a conference call to discuss the current site situation. Additionally, DEP and the District will outline the proper steps that the responsible parties need to take for the site to comply and obtain proper permitting for the activity. 5/2/2024: A Meeting was held with DEP, the District and responsible parties. It was decided that Mr. Coulter will need to start talking to a consulting firm about designing a bridge and compiling an application to submit for the proper permitting for the bridge by the week of June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2024.
- Green Hills Estates, Robeson (PAD060075): 5/1/2024: A pre-construction meeting was held at the
  project site with DEP, the District, the Applicant and the Co-permittee for the new individual permit
  that was issued for the continuation and completion of the project. Erosion and Sediment control
  violations were observed during a walkthrough of the site with all personnel that attended the
  meeting. The District will continue to monitor the site and ensure that any violations are corrected
  before the project starts earth moving and construction again. The DEP will be copied and notified of
  any inspection reports and updates on the site.
- Bollinger Road/341 Hickory Road, Marion Twp (CM-06-00600) (Preserved Farm): Marion Township has submitted the restoration plan. The BCCD has issued a deficiency letter.

- Briarwood Subdivision, South Heidelberg Twp, Walter Greth, Greth Homes: Mr. Greth has two permits that were not terminated and PCSM BMPs that require repair. DEP has decided not to pursue enforcement against Mr. Greth.
- Lyons Solar (PAD060068): The solar panels and PCSM BMPs have been installed; however, the site is not permanently stabilized. The amended soils and permanent seeding are currently being installed. Due to the continued issues that have occurred, the District has sent an enforcement referral to DEP.
